CHHA-BC Enabling Accessibility Project

- CHHA-BC is committed to meeting the collective needs of the entire hard of hearing community province wide. We are grateful to have received government funding through the Enabling Accessibility Fund in order to obtain communication technologies that will increase accessibility to the Provincial Resource Centre as well as the community as a whole.
- At CHHA-BC we recognize that hearing loss is as unique as the individual experiencing it and that there is no one simple solution to managing it. We will thus be obtaining a range of diverse communication technologies. These will include six individual listening systems (Pocketalkers) which can be loaned out, two portable Loop Kits for board meetings and demos in educational workshops, one neck loop, one safe home accessibility system to be installed in the Resource Centre and one Android 5.1 Tablet for hearing impaired communication. Ted from ALDS will also be training our staff regarding the proper use of the technology, who will in turn train our volunteers and educate the community as a whole. We look forward to the visible impact of this project in increasing accessibility for the hard of hearing.

CHHA-BC is thrilled to acknowledge the financial assistance from the Province of British Columbia through a Community Gaming Grant.



CHHA-BC is also providing well over **3000** ear plugs to the "Sky's No Limit, Girls Fly Too" event in March at the Abbotsford International Airport. This initiative to promote hearing health via the provision of hearing protection for all ages is very well received. Thank you to all hearing health professionals that have kindly donated ear plugs!
