CHHA-BC Hearing Loss Online Mentoring Program

CHHA-BC and CHHA Vancouver Branch have recognized expertise in developing peer support programs for hard of hearing and deafened persons. This joint initiative, sponsored by WorkSafe BC, is a web-based mentoring program for people with hearing loss throughout the province of BC. Mentoring will be provided by volunteer peers who are personally experienced in coping with the effects of hearing loss and who have been screened and trained for the mentor role. The program consists of a website, which offers general, useful information on various aspects of coping with hearing loss as well as confidential one-to-one chat rooms, for those seeking guidance and mentoring in adjusting to their hearing loss. Mentees are given the opportunity to develop the tools, knowledge and network to experience an active personal and professional life living with a hearing loss.


Benefits of Being a Mentee:

- Reduce isolation and receive support in a period of transition.
- ➤ Improve communication skills.
- ➤ Get answers to questions and non-judgmental feedback on hard of hearing issues.

This program is designed to provide value added services, including peer support, to those who have experienced hearing loss affecting their well being, family, job, community engagement or quality of life.

- safety technology, noise induced hearing loss prevention programs, workplace accessibility supports, the Tiny Ears campaign, Loop systems and how to foster collaboration between Hearing Health Professionals and CHHA, among many other initiatives, programs and services.
- ⇒ The Breakfast Panel Discussion: Spotlight on Invisible Disabilities, focused on five essential priority areas: administration, employment retention and standards, technology, barrier free access and public education. The goal is to effectively bridge from theory into practice for employment retention and the use of assistive technology. There are means in which the federal government can facilitate this implementation for both short and long terms. Phase II will focus on creating recommendations for policies and standards of practice.
