

The **Canadian Hard of Hearing Association – BC Chapter** has vacancies on its Board of Directors, for the upcoming 2016-2019 term. We are looking for qualified volunteers who are passionate about CHHA-BC and who are interested in serving both the organization and all Canadians affected by hearing loss. The Board of Directors has a maximum of six members. Brief role descriptions are:

- **President:** is responsible for the integrity of the Board's process. He or she represents the Board to outside parties and is the Board's liaison with the Office Administrator of the organization.
- **Vice-President:** fills in for the President as required and takes the lead on assigned initiatives.
- **Treasurer:** manages the Board's review of, and actions related to, the board's financial responsibilities.
- **Secretary:** keeps record of all Board of Director meetings and motions, as well as any other assigned tasks.
- **Director at Large:** participates in all Board meetings and decisions and, like all Board members, will participate in Board Committees and take on extra duties as required

Positions to be filled are: **President, Secretary, Treasurer and Director at Large**. Candidates must be a CHHA member and a B.C. resident. Candidates should provide a brief summary of themselves (200-300 words).
