In July 2021, we hosted a special summer activity held in Queen Elizabeth Park. Participants were thrilled to see each other again and enjoyed the games, painting activities and picnic lunch. In the Okanagan region, 3 in-person activities were held in the Fall and Spring. Altogether 60 participants registered for the BC Buddies events. We will have an upcoming in-person event on May 28th in Surrey where participants will play mini-golf.

Back by popular demand, we are pleased to host an online networking night for Grades 11 and 12 students who seek information about what to expect in post-secondary education. We will also have a panel portion of current post-secondary students sharing their experiences.

In partnership with BC Hands & Voices, Family Network for Deaf Children and Provincial Deaf and Hard of Hearing Services, we are bringing back the annual Family Fun Picnic. The PSP is represented by two volunteers, Renee and Sophia, to sit on the planning committee.

Program Transition

As Bowen and Joy plan their transition out of the Peer Support Program, they developed an orientation guide which will be a reference for the successor. The guide includes information such as overview of services, planning and running events, safety protocols, conflict resolution, communication etiquettes, event marketing strategies, communication with CHHA-BC, and partner contacts.
